Annual Spring Clean-up will be held on April 23rd

The East Campus Neighborhood Spring Clean-Up will be held on Saturday, April 23, 2022 at American Lutheran Church at 42nd & Vine St, from 9am to 1pm, rain or shine.

Drop off your yard clutter, old bikes, old lumber, metal scraps, tires, and other unsightly items at the church parking lot. Do NOT bring: leaves, yard clippings, paint, pesticides, solvents, motor oil and other hazardous waste. There will be a fee for large appliances and tires. The fees will be waived up to \$50 for paid ECCO on site. If arranged in advance, volunteers will be available to pick up items curbside. Call the coordinator at 402-730-0261 by April 16 to arrange for curbside pick-up.

Bring clothing, home goods, furniture and electronics to the Spring Clean-

Up, for recycling by Goodwill through their *Neighborhood Challenge* program. Retail store drop-offs do not count toward the neighborhood total, only items dropped off at the Neighborhood Clean-up site. The top Lincoln neighborhoods that collect the most donations from their collection drives will receive a cash prize for their neighborhood. So clean out your closets and bring that old computer and sofa from the basement to help **ECCO** and your community.

Volunteers are needed for sorting recycling items at the roll-offs. Volunteers with trucks are needed for curbside pick-ups. If you are willing to help out, contact Tom at 402-730-0261 before April 16, 2022.

Robert Bienhoff Memorial Fund established

Many of you know about the recent death of Robert Bienhoff, an East Campus neighborhood resident and long-time ECCO Board member. He was familiar throughout the East Campus community with his blue pickup truck, taking care of many neighborhood yards and sidewalks. He was always ready to step up to help neighbors and the neighborhood with projects and he will be missed.

Some neighbors have organized a memorial fund to honor Robert through the *Lincoln Parks* Foundation and *Lincoln Parks* & Recreation Dept.

Donations will fund a memorial bench near the trolley in Valentino's-Idylwild Park, a plaque for the bench, and nearby plantings of butterfly bushes, which Robert loved. Extra funds will go to the *Valentino's -Idylwild Endowment Fund* for ongoing park care.

Fundraising and installation is planned for completion by the memorial and dedication ceremony on Saturday, May 21, shortly after what would have been Robert's 60th birthday.
